**Thank you to everyone** who responded to my request for your book and program wish list. The response was amazing. We are now working on the list. *More to follow!*

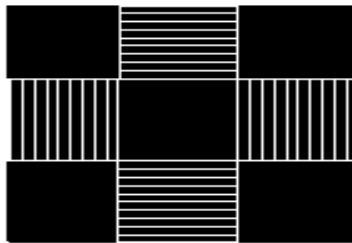
